

## VINYL WALL ART APPLICATION

Vinyl wall art can be applied to almost any smooth, flat surface, including walls, mirrors, and windows. The surface will need to be dry, clean, smooth, and NOT freshly painted. Fresh paint should be allowed to “cure” for two weeks before applying vinyl wall art.

You will need a ruler or tape measure, level, and a pencil to map out the area where you wish to apply the vinyl. A sturdy plastic credit card or similar object with smooth edges can be used to securely transfer the vinyl to your selected surface.

- 1) Locate and mark on your surface using a pencil, the center of the area both horizontally and vertically, that you wish to place your wall art. Repeat this step on your sheet of vinyl wall art. You may also want to make small marks on the left and right sides of your surface space to create a level line to follow when applying the vinyl.
- 2) Carefully remove the opaque backer sheet slowly to make sure the design remains attached to the clear transfer sheet.
- 3) Carefully apply the vinyl wall art sheet up onto the application surface matching the centers and the level line.
- 4) Using the edge of a credit card or similar smooth object, gently rub across the vinyl art to smooth out any air bubbles and secure the transfer.
- 5) After securing your vinyl art to your surface, carefully remove the transfer sheet by peeling it away from the wall at a sharp angle. Finally, press and rub over the vinyl using your finger to secure the adhesive.

**NOTE:** Vinyl wall art can be easily removed by gently peeling up an edge of the vinyl and slowly pulling it off the wall. In most cases the vinyl cannot be reused.
